Nomination and application process

NOMINATION (Undergraduate and Graduate)	Students must be nominated by their home institution through the Ontario Tech Inbound Student Exchange Nomination Form. Home institutions must have a valid student exchange agreement with Ontario Tech University. Note: Ontario Tech respects the minimum GPA requirement the host institution determines in their internal processes to nominate students. Approval for exchange is subject to faculty approval and course availability.	Deadlines Summer term: February 15 Fall term: March 15 Winter term: September 15*
APPLICATION	After a student is nominated by their home institution and approved to proceed, the nominated student must: 1. Complete the online exchange application and upload their supporting documentation: Copy of valid passport: Valid for at least 6 months after the expected return date. Transcript: Undergraduate students are required to provide their current university transcripts. Recommendation letter: Must be sent from the home university. including confirmation of English language skills. 2. Complete the Inbound Student Exchange Course Selection form	Deadlines Summer term: March 15 Fall term: April 15 Winter term: October 15*

Academics

Ontario Tech accepts applications from both undergraduate and graduate exchange students. Exchange students must be registered full time at their home university. They are permitted to take courses across faculties provided they meet the pre-requisite qualifications and have permission from both their home institution and host faculty at Ontario Tech.

English language requirements

The language of instruction at Ontario Tech is English. All incoming exchange students must have sufficient <u>undergraduate</u> and <u>graduate</u> English language proficiency to be successful in their level of study.

Graduate study

Students who wish to apply to the graduate level must have completed four years of university or equivalent in their area of study.

Courses at Ontario Tech

Students can take a maximum of five courses per term. To be considered full-time as an undergraduate student, students must be enrolled in a minimum of three courses.

Students are required to <u>choose their courses</u> when they submit their application. They will be asked to provide their top and secondary course choices when they submit their application. We will work to register students in their top choices, however, there is no guarantee that courses will be available.

As a guide, where applicable, 3 credits = 1 course = 6 ECTS.

Grading system

Incoming exchange students should familiarize themselves with the university grading system for <u>Undergraduate students</u> or <u>Graduate students</u>.

Transcript

At the end of the exchange, once grade are released, students can <u>request their official</u> <u>transcript</u> online through <u>MyOntarioTech</u>.

Financial information

Fees

Exchange students are responsible for two fees while studying at Ontario Tech: <u>UHIP and U-Pass fees</u> can be paid before or upon arrival through various <u>payment options.</u>

These host families (and their homes) have gone through an application and screening process to make sure they are suitable for hosting Ontario Tech students.

Immigration information

After the university has received and assessed the exchange application, the university will send you an official Letter of Admission. You will require this letter to get a Canadian Study Permit and/or entry visa/temporary resident visa (TRV).

In most cases, exchange students do not require a study permit since their length of stay is usually less than six months (one semester). However, they may still apply for a study permit if they like. For programs of six months or longer in duration (two semesters), exchange students must apply for a study permit.
